DISCLOSURES REQUIRED BY PROCUREMENT STATUTE AND REGULATIONS

In accordance with Guam Procurement Law, the following representations and disclosures shall be conspicuously set forth in all proposals and contracts. **Notarized Affidavits for Disclosures must be submitted.**

1. Disclosure of Major Shareholders. [5 GCA \$5233; 2 GAR, Div. 4 \$3109(e)(3)(E)]

As a condition of bidding, any partnership, sole proprietorship or corporation doing business with the government of Guam shall submit an affidavit executed under oath that lists the name and address of any person who has held more than ten percent (10%) of the outstanding interest or shares in said partnership, sole proprietorship or corporation at any time during the twelve (12) month period immediately preceding submission of a bid. The affidavit shall contain the number of shares or the percentage of all assets of such partnership, sole proprietorship or corporation which have held by each such person during the twelve (12) month period. In addition, the affidavit shall contain the name and address of any person who has received or is entitled to receive a commission, gratuity or other compensation for procuring or assisting in obtaining business related to the bid for the bidder and shall also contain the amounts of any such commission, gratuity or other compensation. The affidavit shall be open and available to the public for inspection and copying.

2. Independent Price Determination. [2 GAR, Div. 4 §3126(b)]

Every solicitation shall provide that by submitting a bid or offer, the bidder or offeror certifies that the price submitted was independently arrived at without collusion.

3. Representation Regarding Gratuities and Kickbacks. [5 GCA \$5630(c); 2 GAR, Div. 4 \$11107(3)]

The bidder, offeror, or contractor represents that it has not violated, is not violating, and promises that it will not violate the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth in \$11206 (Gratuities and Kickbacks) of the Guam Procurement Regulations.

4. Representation Regarding Ethical Standards for Government Employees and Former Government Employees. (2 GAR, Div. 4 §11103(b))

The bidder, offeror, or contractor represents that it has not knowingly influenced and promises that it will not knowingly influence a government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in 5 GCA Chapter 5 Article 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the Guam Procurement Act and in Chapter 11 of the Guam Procurement Regulations.

NOTICES REQUIRED BY PROCUREMENT STATUTE AND REGULATIONS

1. Cancellation of Invitations for Bids or Requests for Proposals. [5 GCA \$5225; 2 GAR, Div. 4 \$3115(c)]

An Invitation for Bids, a Request for Proposals, or other solicitation may be cancelled, or any or all bids or proposals may be rejected in whole or in part as may be specified in the solicitation, when it is in the best interests of the Territory in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Policy of the Territory in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Policy Office.

2. Rejection of Individual Bids or Proposals. [2 GAR, Div. 4 §3115(e)(2)]

Each solicitation issued by the territory shall provide that any bid or proposal may be rejected in whole or in part when in the best interest of the Territory.

3. Multiple or Alternate Bids or Proposals. [2 GAR, Div. 4 §3102(d)]

Unless multiple or alternate bids or proposals are specifically provided for, the solicitation shall state that such bids or proposals shall not be accepted. When prohibited, multiple or alternate bids or proposals shall be rejected, provided that if a bidder clearly indicates a base bid, it shall be considered for award as though it were the only bid or proposal submitted by the bidder or offeror.

Types of Contracts. [2 GAR, Div. 4 §3119(k)(1)].

Contract Provision. When a contract is to contain an option for renewal, extension, or purchase, notice of such provision shall be included in the solicitation. Exercise of the option is always at the territory's discretion only, and not subject to agreement or acceptance by the contractor.

SPECIAL PROVISION FOR CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY

All bidders are required to submit a copy of current Certificate of Authority. Bids submitted by a nonadmitted insurer will be considered only if insurers in Guam with current Certificate of Authority are not able to provide the amount or kind of insurance required.

Excerpts from 22 GCA Chapter 15 Article 1:

\$15101. Authority of Insurer. A person shall not transact insurance in Guam as an insurer without being admitted, and when admitted, shall not transact any class of insurance which is not specifically authorized by his certificate.

\$15102. Certificate of Authority. Admission is secured by procuring a Certificate of Authority from the Commissioner. Such certificate shall not be granted until the applicant conforms to the applicable requirements of this Title and of the other laws of Guam prerequisite to its issue. After a certificate is granted, the insurer shall continue to comply with the requirements pertaining to it as set forth in this Title and in the other laws of Guam.

\$15803. Affidavit as Prerequisite to Procurance of Insurance: Contents. Before the person named in such license shall procure, effect or issue any such insurance policy or indemnity contract or surety bond, he or she shall in every case execute and file with the Commissioner his or her affidavit in acceptable form that the insured is unable to procure in any company or companies or insurers admitted to do business in Guam the amount or kind of insurance necessary to protect the property or undertakings of the insured, described in such affidavit at rates not less than the minimum rates on such property promulgated by an authorized rating bureau or other bureau or conference whose rates have been accepted by the Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, and filed in the insurance department as the fair and equitable rate.

V	3.	TAXES: Bidders are cautioned that they are subject to Guam Income Taxes as well as all other taxes on Guam Transactions. Specific information on taxes may be obtained from the Director of Revenue and Taxation.
7	4.	LICENSING: Bidders are cautioned that the Government will not consider for award any offer submitted by a bidder who has not complied with the Guam Licensing Law. Specific information on licenses may be obtained from
7	5.	LOCAL PROCUREMENT PREFERENCE: All procurement of supplies and services where possible, will be made from amount businesses licensed to do business on Guam in accordance with Section 5008 of the Guam
V	6.	COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIFICATIONS AND OTHER SOLICITATION REQUIREMENTS: Bidders shall comply with all specifications and other requirements of the Solicitation.
7	7.	"ALL OR NONE" BIDS: NOTE: By checking this item, the Government is requesting all of the bid items to be bidded or none at all. The Government will not award on an itemized basis.

Where basic or alternate bid meets the minimum required specification, cost and other factors will be considered. Failure to explain this requirement will result in rejection of the bid.

BID GUARANTEE REQUIREMENT: Bidder is required to submit a Bid Guarantee Bond or standby irrevocable Letter of Credit or Certified Check or Cashier's Check in the same bid envelope to be held by the Government pending award. All payments for this purpose shall be by cash, certified check or money order and shall be made payable to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund.

2. PREPARATION OF BIDS:

- a) Bidders are required to examine the drawings, specifications, schedule and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at bidder's risk.
- b) Each bidder shall furnish the information required by the Solicitation. The bidder shall sign the solicitation and print or type his name on the Schedule. Erasures or other changes must be initialed by the person signing the bid. Bids signed by an agent are to be accompanied by evidence of this authority unless such evidence has been previously furnished to the issuing office.

As a cost of doing business with the Government of Guam, there is an established withholding assessment fee for a non-resident person without a valid Guam business license, which shall be equal to four percent (4%) of the total dollar value of a contract awarded for all Government of Guam contracts for professional services provided by a non-resident person residing outside of Guam. The agency awarding the contract or the agency's representative awarding the contract shall, at the time of the contract award, in the instance of a contract for professional services to a person who does not possess a valid Guam business license under Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, and who is not a resident of Guam, deduct from funds allocated for the contract an amount equal to four percent (4%) of the total dollar value

of a contract awarded, and shall transmit the funds to the Treasurer of Guam for deposit in the General Fund. The amount of the withholding assessment fee withheld shall by duly noted in the payment statements to the Contractor. 11 GCA §71114.

Past Claims:

The People of Guam v. John A. Rios and Carl T.C. Gutierrez

Superior Court of Guarn Criminal Case No. CF0216-04

Details: On July 1, 2003 in the Superior Court of Guam, Mr. John A. Rios, former Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund w. indicted on criminal charges. On July 25, 2005 in the Superior Court of Guam, all charges were dismissed.

David J. Lubofsky v. Government of Guam; Government of Guam Retirement Fund

Superior Court of Guam Civil Case No. CV0958-05

Details: On October 10, 2005 in the Superior Court of Guam, Mr. David J. Lubofsky filed an action asking for an award of disability retirement benefits. On April 26, 2006, the Board of Trustees of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund granted Mr. Lubofsky's request for disability retirement benefits retroactive to a commencement date of May 19, 2004. On February 15, 2007 in the Superior Court of Guam, the cast was dismissed without prejudice.

The People of Guarn v. John A. Rios, Carl T.C. Gutierrez and Gil Shinohara

Superior Court of Guam Criminal Case No. CF0401-5

Details: On December 16, 2005 in the Superior Court of Guam, Mr. John A. Rios, former Director of the Government of Guam Retiremer Fund was indicted on felony and misdemeanor charges. On February 10, 2006, in the Superior Court of Guam, an Order Granting the Defendant(s) Motion to dismiss Criminal Case No. CF0401-5 was ordered.

Pangelinan v. Government of Guam Retirement Fund

Superior Court of Guam Special Proceedings Case No. SP0181-10.

Details: Mr. Pangelinan filed an appeal of the Fund's denial of his application for disability retirement benefits. The Superior Court of Guardismissed the action based on untimeliness, and no appeal was taken.

Saville v. Government of Guam Retirement Fund

Superior Court of Guam Special Proceedings Case No. SP0146-06

Details: Mr. Saville's Estate filed an appeal of the Fund's denial of his application for disability retirement benefits. The Superior Court of Guam ruled that the Fund erred in having the decision denying the application decided by a Board committee, rather than the Board as whole. The Fund was also ordered to pay a certain amount in attorney's fees. This matter is now closed.

• The People of Guarn v. John A. Rios and Carl T.C. Gutierrez

Superior Court of Guam Criminal Appeal No. 05 08

Details: In this criminal matter, Defendant John A. Rios sought reimbursement of attorney's fees incurred to defend against criminal charge for actions taken while employed as Executive Director of the Fund. As part of a settlement, the Fund agreed to pay Mr. Rios' fees up to certain cap.

Story v. Government of Guam Retirement Fund

Superior Court of Guam Special Proceedings Case No. SP0035-09

Details: Ms. Story, a Defined Benefit Plan member, alleged that the Fund improperly denied her disability retirement benefits. Court grante GGRF's motion for summary judgment. Ms. Story will not recover anything from GGRF.

Bautista v. Perez, et al.

Superior Court of Guam Civil Case No. CV1848 01

Details: In 2003, the Superior Court of Guam outlined four fiduciary obligations of the Fund. In 2011, one of the Plaintiffs filed motion asking the Court to enforce its 2003 Order; one motion was denied, one motion was determined to be moot and one motion is pending. fourth motion seeks that the Fund reimburse the Plaintiff for his attorney's fees. This motion for fees was denied.

Pending Claim:

Chargualaf v. Government of Guam Retirement Fund

Superior Court of Guam Special Proceedings Case No. SP0007-18

Details: Mr. Chargualaf, a Defined Benefit Plan member, asked the Fund to interpret its enabling statute in a manner that would reflect highest annual salaries as the same amounts recorded on his W-2GUs for the years 2013-2015. The Fund denied Mr. Chargualaf request. The Superior Court further denied Mr. Chargualaf's Verified Petition for Writ of Mandate and affirmed the Fund's decision. The matter is pending in the Supreme Court of Guam.

- (4) A combination of the aforementioned duties the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).

Any computer employee who meets the applicable compensation requirements and the above duties test qualifies as an exempt computer professional under both section 13(a)(1) and section 13(a)(17) of the Fair Labor Standards Act. (Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2006-3 (Dec. 14 2006)). Accordingly this wage determination will not apply to any exempt computer employee regardless of which of these two exemptions is utilized.

- 2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS NIGHT PAY 6 SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am.
- If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime
- (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening blending dying mixing and pressing of sensitive ordnance explosives and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization modification renovation demolition and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands face or arms of the employee engaged in the operation irritation of the skin minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving unlcading storage and hauling of ordnance explosive and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance explosives and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract by the employer by the state or local law etc.) the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost) reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of ""wash and wear"" materials may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning daily washing or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract by the contractor by law or by the nature of the work there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance

** REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE Standard Form 1444 (SF-1444) **

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e. the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination) be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e. appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees

(See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification wage rate and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s) a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s) job description(s) and rationale for proposed wage rate(s) including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved or where there is no authorized representative the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees to the U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt the Wage and Hour Division approves modifies or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember it is not the job title but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split combine or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1))."
